AFRICAN TRADITIONS

In South Africa, it's customary to write heartfelt love letters and exchange them with

loved ones on Valentine's Day. These letters often contain poetic verses.

Ghana is one of the world's largest producers of cocoa, which is why chocolate plays a major role in Valentine's Day celebrations. Feb. 14 is "National Chocolate Day" and there are music events, special restaurant menus and performances around the country.

In Morocco and Egypt, they celebrate "Day of Love and Friendship" or "Day of Love

and Affection." Both couples and friends celebrate by exchanging gifts and spending time together.

SOUTH AMERICAN TRADITIONS

Brazil celebrates Dia dos Namorados on June 12, a day dedicated to lovers. Couples exchange gifts, go on romantic dates and enjoy the music festivals and street parades that celebrate love and affection.

Argentines aren't willing

to limit their celebration of love to a single day. In July, they have "the week of sweetness" where lovers exchange kisses, chocolates and other sweets.

In Peru, Valentine's Day celebrates friendship as well as lovers. Chocolates are made and exchanged for the occasion and orchids surpass roses as the most popular flower to gift.

Throughout Latin America, flowers, letters and chocolates are popular gifts and it is traditional to wear a red dress if you are celebrating as a couple. Others create mailboxes that they stuff with love letters.

EUROPEAN TRADITIONS

Paris, often called the city of love, is steeped in Valentine's Day traditions from exchanging heartfelt love letters and enjoying romantic meals. Tradition has it that Charles, the Duke of Orleans, sent the first-ever Valentine's Day card to his wife while he was in prison in 1415.

In Wales, a traditional Valentine's Day gift is the "love spoon." These intricately carved wooden spoons symbolize affection and commitment. Gifting a love spoon has been part of Welsh culture for centuries.

In Denmark and Norway, the exchange of snowdrop flowers is a cherished tradition. Men send these delicate blooms as a token of affection and the number of snowdrops in the bouquet carries special significance.
