

NAVY AND DOVE



Adding fruit or vegetables to



a bouquet can be absolutely stunning — and perfectly on-trend. Pomegranates and artichokes are popular choices right now, and apples are clearly a fall favorite.

Don't forget smaller fruits,

such as cheery little kumquats. If you love your greens, cabbage and kale also add a dramatic flare to any arrangement.

RIBBON AND TWINE

What you use to secure your

bouquet can significantly add to its beauty. If you are having a rustic wedding, consider twine, which can be found in many colors.

Using a ribbon is a classic choice with so many options.

Consider the thickness of the ribbon, material (silk, satin, velvet, lace) — not to mention color. Be sure the color you choose complements the bouquet rather than detracting from it.

THAT FRENCH COUNTRYSIDE KIND OF FEELING ... Redmond, Wash.


Not much feels more French chic than getting married in a field of lavender. There are plenty to choose from in Washington State.
