
Work of the Vinedresser & Abiding in Christ (Part 2)

Branch = us

Vine = Jesus Christ Vinedresser = Heavenly Father





I Am the True Vine

15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinedresser. ² Every branch in me that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit. ³ Already you are clean because of the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴ Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into

the fire, and burned. ⁷ If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. ⁸ By this my Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit and so prove to be my disciples. ⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

In order to abide with Him, we've got to have the:

- **KNIFE** of the Lord
- **LOVE OF** the Lord
- **VITAL CONNECTION** to the Lord (helpless)
- **WORD** of the Lord (knowing/obeying His commands)
- **IOY** of the Lord

KNIFE OF THE LORD

GOD'S WORK as a VINEDRESSER	OUR ABIDING while under PRUNING
1. Judges unfruitful branches (unbelievers)	Submitting to ambiguity
2. Prunes fruitful branches (believers)	Seeing Jesus accurately, not ignorantlyFinding joy by drawing like never before

Purpose of pruning: To bear more fruit

LOVE OF THE LORD

⁹ As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Abide in my love.

VITAL CONNECTION TO THE LORD (helpless)

⁴Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me.

WORD OF THE LORD (knowing/obeying His commands)

¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.

JOY OF THE LORD

¹¹These things I have spoken to you, that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full.

Sapping our joy. Sometimes, we just don't believe these clear statements from Jesus.
