Genesis 5:21-24

²¹ When Enoch had lived 65 years, he fathered Methuselah. ²² Enoch walked with God after he fathered Methuselah 300 years and had other songs and daughters. ²³ Thus all the days of Enoch were 365 years. ²⁴ Enoch walked with God, and he was not, for God took him.

Hebrews 11:5-6

⁵ By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. ⁶ And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who seek Him.

Micah 6:8

He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

Table Discussion Questions:

1. How could a sinful man ever walk with or please the Lord?

2. "Walking with God" implies a relationship. Unpack the implications of this metaphor in our relationship with the Lord.

- 3. How do you want to cultivate a closer walk with the Lord?
- 4. Why is it impossible to please God without faith?

5. Why must we believe that God rewards us when we seek Him? What other rewards do we seek that distract us from seeking our ultimate reward in Jesus Christ?

6. How might our walk with God impact those around us? What keeps you from shining the light of Christ in the contexts where He has called you?

7. If Enoch had a tombstone, it might have said, "He walked with God." What phrases would you want (or not want) on yours?
