

## Lesson One: The Snare Judges 2:1-5 Paul Goebel - January 18, 2022

**2** Now the angel of the LORD went up from Gilgal to Bochim. And he said, "I brought you up from Egypt and brought you into the land that I swore to give to your fathers. I said, 'I will never break my covenant with you, <sup>2</sup> and you shall make no covenant with the inhabitants of this land; you shall break down their altars.' But you have not obeyed my voice. What is this you have done? <sup>3</sup> So now I say, I will not drive them out before you, but they shall become thorns in your sides, and their gods shall be a snare to you." <sup>4</sup> As soon as the angel of the LORD spoke these words to all the people of Israel, the people lifted up their voices and wept. <sup>5</sup> And they called the name of that place Bochim. And they sacrificed there to the LORD.

- 6. How did the people of Israel respond to the angel's message? (See Judges 2:4) What does this teach us about genuine repentance?
