

Lesson Fourteen: The Kingdom Without the King Judges 19:1, Judges 21:25 Paul Goebel – May 3, 2022

Judges 19 ¹In those days, when there was no king in Israel, a certain Levite was sojourning in the remote parts of the hill country of Ephraim, who took to himself a concubine from Bethlehem in Judah.

Judges 21 ²⁵ In those days there was no king in Israel. Everyone did what was right in his own eyes.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How would you summarize the primary message of the book of Judges?
- 2. Why is the final story of Judges a fitting end to a tragic book?
- 3. How did the people of Israel become just like their surrounding culture? What are some ways our culture has influenced you?
- 4. How should we respond to the final story of Judges? How should we respond to our own sin?
- 5. In what way are we enemies of God? (See Romans 5:10) Why did Jesus call us to love our enemies? How did Jesus love His enemies?
- 6. How is sin self-destructive? How are our own attempts to solve our problems also self-destructive?
- 7. How does this story (and the rest of Judges) reveal our need for a Savior King?
