Questions for Discussion

- 1. What do you learn about Jesus and the family of Lazarus, Martha, and Mary from verses 3 and 5? Why does that make verse 6 mysterious? How is this like experiences Christians have now when catastrophic events happen in our lives? What must we remember?
- 2. What did Jesus say about the outcome and the purpose of Lazarus illness? (Verse 4) How is this a general principle for our lives?
- 3. Why were the disciples concerned about going to Bethany? Why were they confused about what Jesus did (why He stayed, and why He went)?
- 4. What are your thoughts about Martha's words to Jesus? (Verses 21, 22, 24) How would you describe her faith?
- 5. How would you express in your own words what Jesus revealed to Martha in verses 25 and 26? How is this the answer to all His people's hardships and disasters?
- 6. What is your response to Jesus' reaction to Mary and the scene at Lazarus' tomb?
- 7. What is the significance of Jesus' raising of Lazarus? What does this say about His power to change and renew our lives—habits, speech, attitudes, now?
- 8. How have you been helped, challenged, inspired by the series about Jesus' redemption of our speech?
