

## Lesson Five: David's Prayer of Confession Psalm 51 Matt Fray – October 11, 2022

51 Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy

blot out my transgressions.

<sup>2</sup> Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin!

<sup>3</sup> For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.

 <sup>4</sup> Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight, so that you may be justified in your words and blameless in your judgment.

<sup>5</sup> Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me.

<sup>6</sup> Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.

<sup>7</sup> Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

<sup>8</sup>Let me hear joy and gladness;

let the bones that you have broken rejoice.

<sup>9</sup> Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities.

<sup>10</sup> Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

- <sup>11</sup> Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me.
- <sup>12</sup> Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit.
- <sup>13</sup> Then I will teach transgressors your ways, and sinners will return to you.
- <sup>14</sup> Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation,
  - and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.
- <sup>15</sup> O Lord, open my lips,
  - and my mouth will declare your praise.
- <sup>16</sup> For you will not delight in sacrifice, or I would give it; you will not be pleased with a burnt offering.
- <sup>17</sup> The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit;a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- <sup>18</sup> Do good to Zion in your good pleasure; build up the walls of Jerusalem;
- <sup>19</sup> then will you delight in right sacrifices, in burnt offerings and whole burnt offerings; then bulls will be offered on your altar.

## Discussion Questions

- 1. How do you tend to respond when you realize you have sinned? How do you feel? What do you do? Whom do you tell?
- 2. Why is prayer an essential first step in responding to our sin?
- 3. Read Psalm 51:1. According to lines two and three ("according to...") what is the foundation for our prayers of confession? Why should this give us confidence in confession?
- 4. Read Psalm 51:7. What is hyssop? How does it point us to the cross of Jesus Christ (see Hebrews 9:13-14, 19-20)? How might this influence the way you pray?
- 5. Close your small group time by praying together based on Psalm 51:17, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, You will not despise."

As you pray Psalm 51:17, keep this simple and wise advice in mind: "To pray the Bible, you simply go through the passage line by line, talking to God about whatever comes to mind as you read the text (Donald Whitney, <u>Praying the Bible</u>, p. 33)."
