3. What is the doctrine of the Trinity? Why is the doctrine of the Trinity foundational to the story of creation? How Trinitarian is your understanding of God?
4. In what way does believing that God is the creator of all things shape your view of the world and the meaning of life?
5. How was the Spirit of God at work at creation? How is the Spirit of God now at work in our re-creation? (See Romans 8:9-30)
6. Where do we see the work of the Son in Genesis 1:1-3? How does this correspond with John 1:1-5?
7. How does the Son’s work at creation give us hope for the New Creation to come?
