Discussion Questions:

- 1. What assumptions do you have about the world that might influence your reading of Genesis? How might our study of Genesis challenge these assumptions?
- 2. What is the primary question that the Biblical story of creation seeks to answer? How is this question different from the questions we often ask about the creation story?
- 3. What is the doctrine of the Trinity? Why is the doctrine of the Trinity foundational to the story of creation? How Trinitarian is your understanding of God?
- 4. In what way does believing that God is the creator of all things shape your view of the world and the meaning of life?
- 5. How was the Spirit of God at work at creation? How is the Spirit of God now at work in our re-creation? (See Romans 8:9-30)
- 6. Where do we see the work of the Son in Genesis 1:1-3? How does this correspond with John 1:1-5?
- 7. How does the Son's work at creation give us hope for the New Creation to come?
