

Lesson Ten: Perfect Love 1 John 4:13-21 Paul Goebel | November 14, 2023

¹³ By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. ¹⁴ And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. ¹⁵ Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. ¹⁶ So we have come to know and to believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him. ¹⁷ By this is love perfected with us, so that we may have confidence for the day of judgment, because as he is so also we in this world. ¹⁸ There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear. For fear has to do with punishment, and whoever fears has not been perfected in love. ¹⁹ We love because he first loved us. ²⁰ If anyone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen cannot [a] love God whom he has not seen. ²¹ And this commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What does it mean to abide in God? According to John, how do we know that we abide in Him?
- 2. How has God loved us? What does the love of God have to do with the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ?
- 3. How does love cast out fear? How is our failure to love rooted in fear?
- 4. What is perfect love? How does this kind of love compare to our society's definition of love?
- 5. What does the statement, "he loved us first" (See 1 John 4:19), teach us about the Gospel?
- 6. Read 1 John 4:21, 1 John 3:11, and Matthew 22:35-40. What does loving God have to do with loving your brother? Why are these two loves so deeply connected?
