

Lesson Two: The Holiness of God Robby Higginbottom | January 23, 2024

Isaiah 6:1-8

¹ In the year that King Uzziah died I saw the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up; and the train of His robe filled the temple. ² Above Him stood the seraphim. Each had six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. ³ And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy, is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory!"

- ⁴ And the foundations of the thresholds shook at the voice of him who called, and the house was filled with smoke. ⁵ And I said: "Woe is me! For I am lost; for I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips; for my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts!"
- ⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me, having in his hand a burning coal that he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ And he touched my mouth and said: "Behold, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away, and your sin atoned for."
- ⁸ And I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for Us?" Then I said, "Here I am! Send me."

Discussion Questions:

- 1. When we say "God is holy," what does that mean?
 What do the different definitions teach us about God and about ourselves?
- 2. When Isaiah caught a true glimpse of God's holiness, how did he respond? (6:1-5)
- 3. Isaiah saw this vision in the year that King Uzziah died (6:1). When and how has the Lord opened our eyes to see His holiness and our sin?
- 4. What did the angel do for Isaiah in verses 6 and 7? Did Isaiah expect or deserve this?
- 5. What does our holy God demand from us? What does our gracious God provide for us?
- 6. How can an unholy man become holy? How do we grow in holiness?
- 7. In *The Holiness of God*, RC Sproul writes, "God was able to take a shattered man and send him into the ministry." (6:8) How is God writing the same story in your own life? When we feel disqualified to be sent or used by God, what do we need to remember?
