#### The Words of Institution and Distribution of the Elements

Please come forward to receive the elements taking the empty cup back to your seat.

We have come to the Lord's Table at the invitation of the Lord Himself, and so we come on His terms. Therefore, Park Cities Presbyterian Church welcomes to the Lord's Table all those who have trusted in Jesus Christ as Savior and who acknowledge Him as Lord. Because Communion is a sacrament of the church, all are welcome to partake who are baptized members in an evangelical church (a church where the Gospel is loved and proclaimed). It is our request that children not participate in the Lord's Supper until they themselves have become communing members of such a church. We come not as those who are intrinsically righteous, but as those who have been given through grace the righteousness of our perfect Redeemer. So, while we repent of known sin as we come, we recognize our standing before the Father is completely dependent on the accomplishment of Jesus Christ for His people.
