God's covenants provide the foundation and structure for life. Marriage is best understood as a covenant, a three-way commitment between the man, the woman and the Lord. Parents and children can best relate to one another in their awareness of God's covenant with the family. Responsibilities at work derive meaning only from understanding the bond that God first made with the world at creation.

Often it is suggested that the inclusion of infants in the covenant leads to presumption, but the original Word of God establishing the seal of this covenant clearly points in the direction of personal responsibility. Covenant-keeping is an essential part of the covenant's structure. Abraham and his seed must keep the covenant. Far from fostering presumption, the application of the seal of the covenant to children binds them to faithfulness in keeping the vows by which they are obligated in the covenant. (based on Genesis 17.6-8)

God deals with families in the bonds of the covenant. The created order of families is not ignored in God's redemptive provisions. God has committed Himself to the restoration of family units in His plans of redemption.
