**The Morning Sermon** "The King of Time" Dr. Ryan
For the Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath. Matthew 12.8

Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but He rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. Exodus 20.8-11

Human nature generally requires a designated time set apart for the worship of God. By a positive, moral and unending commandment in His Word, God makes this a requirement of everyone in all ages. He has specifically chosen one day in seven for a Sabbath to be kept separate for Himself. This was the last day of the week from the beginning of the world until the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Beginning with the resurrection of Jesus Christ this was changed to the first day of the week which the Scripture calls the Lord's Day. This institution is to be continued until the end of the world functioning as the Christian Sabbath.
