Adapted from Shorter Catechism, Qs. 16, 20, 21, 38

Christian, did you fall in Adam's first transgression? **The covenant being made with Adam, not only for himself but for all mankind, means that, through ordinary generation, I sinned in him and fell with him in his first transgression.** Then did God leave you to perish in your estate of sin and

misery? **God, having out of his mere good pleasure, from all eternity, elected some to everlasting life, entered into a covenant of grace to deliver us out of our estate of misery and sin, and to bring us to an estate of salvation by our Redeemer. Who is your Redeemer? My only Redeemer is my Lord Jesus Christ, who, being the eternal Son of God, became man, and so was, and continues to be, God and man in two distinct natures, and one person forever.
