## **Today's Scripture Passages**

#### Jonah 1.1-7, 15-17

 $^{\rm 1}$  The word of the Lord came to Jonah son of Amittai:  $^{\rm 2}$  "Go to the great city of Nineveh and preach against it, because its wickedness has come up before Me."

<sup>3</sup> But Jonah ran away from the LORD and headed for Tarshish. He went down to Joppa, where he found a ship bound for that port, to flee from the LORD.

<sup>4</sup> Then the LORD sent a great wind on the sea, and such a violent storm arose that the ship threatened to break up. <sup>5</sup> All the sailors were afraid and each cried out to his own god. And they threw the cargo into the sea to lighten the ship. But Jonah had gone below deck, where he lay down and fell into a deep sleep.

<sup>6</sup> The captain went to him and said, "How can you sleep? Get up and call on your god! Maybe He will take notice of us, and we will not perish."

<sup>7</sup> Then the sailors said to each other, "Come, let us cast lots to find out who is responsible for this calamity." They cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah.

 $^{15}$  Then they took Jonah and threw him overboard, and the raging sea grew calm.  $^{16}$  At this the men greatly feared the LORD, and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made vows to him.

<sup>17</sup> But the LORD provided a great fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was inside the fish three days and three nights.

#### Jonah 2.8-10

8 "Those who cling to worthless idols forfeit the grace that could be theirs.
9 But I, with a song of thanksgiving, will sacrifice to You. What I have vowed I will make good. Salvation comes from the LORD."

<sup>10</sup> And the Lord commanded the fish, and it vomited Jonah onto dry land.

## Jonah 3.3-5, 10

<sup>3</sup> Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very important city—a visit required three days. <sup>4</sup> On the first day, Jonah started into the city. He proclaimed: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overturned." <sup>5</sup> The Ninevites believed God. They declared a fast, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth.

<sup>10</sup> When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, He had compassion and did not bring upon them the destruction He had threatened.

## Jonah 4.1-4, 11

 $^1\mathrm{But}$  Jonah was greatly displeased and became angry.  $^2$  He prayed to the LORD, "O LORD, is this not what I said when I was still at home? That is why I was so quick to flee to Tarshish. I knew that You are a gracious and compassionate God, slow to anger and abounding in love, a God who relents from sending calamity.  $^3$  Now, O LORD, take away my life, for it is better for me to die than to live."  $^4$  But the LORD replied, "Have you any right to be angry?"

 $^{\rm 11}$  But the Lord said, "Nineveh has more than an hundred and twenty thousand people who cannot tell their right hand from their left. Should I not be concerned about that great city?"
