## **Public Confession of Sin**

How can we dwell with Your blessing as we flitter with superficial activity, casual relationships and self-exaltation? O Lord, strike us with Your blinding light. Expose our

blindness that we may see how blind we are. Stop us in our intentioned sins. And, like Saul of Tarsus, restore us to the life of all things made new: from blindness by things seen to living by things unseen, from idol makers to God fearers, from persecution to pursuing in love. Have mercy upon up us, O Lord, as we confess our particular sins to You now.
