The Larger Catechism, Question 191

When we pray "Thy Kingdom come" we acknowledge ourselves and all mankind to be by nature under the dominion of sin and Satan. We pray to be furnished with all gospel-officers and ordinances, purged from corruption: that the ordinances of Christ may be purely dispensed, made effectual to the converting of those that are yet in their sins, and the confirming, comforting, and building up of those that are already converted, that Christ would rule in our hearts here, and hasten the time of His second coming and our reigning with Him forever: and that He would be pleased to exercise the kingdom of His power in all the world.
