The Morning Sermon "Faith and Works" Dr. Ryan
What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does
not have works? Can that faith save him? —James 2.14

Westminster Confession of Faith, Chapter 16

- 1. The good works of faith come only from what God commands in His holy Word. Behavior contrived by human tradition is not warranted as the good works of faith whether done out of senseless zeal or even through the pretense of good intention.
- 2. These good works of faith, done in obedience to God's commandments, are the resultant fruits and encouraging evidences of a true and living faith. By good works of faith, we declare and make known our thankfulness to God, strengthen our assurance in God's covenant, educate and build our brothers and sisters in the faith, demonstrate the concrete realities of our professed faith in the good news of Christ, stop the accusing mouths of our enemies, and finally, reveal the real glory of God. All of this makes clear who really works within us. Created in Christ Jesus for the good works of faith, believers come to mature holiness. Thus, we gain our desire of eternal life.

Teach me, O Lord, Thy holy way, and give me an obedient mind; That in Thy service I may find my soul's delight from day to day.

Bless me in ev'ry task, O Lord, begun, continued, done for Thee; Fulfil Thy perfect work in me; and Thine abounding grace afford.
