





Public Confession of Sin





- 3. What is the connection between patience and kindness?
- 4. How does patience and kindness show love?
- 5. How can we be kind to those who have been unkind to us?
- 6. Why are we supposed to love this way?
- 7. How can we love this way?

Questions for older children

- 8. Describe a time when you didn't love someone with patience and kindness. Why?
- 9. Why is it so hard to love this way?
- 10. How is the cross central to our ability to love this way?

Scripture Memory (memorize this verse of Scripture this month)

Galatians 2.20
