- Wisdom cries aloud in the street, in the markets she raises her voice;
- ²¹ at the head of the noisy streets she cries out; at the entrance of the city gates she speaks:
- ²² "How long, O simple ones, will you love being simple? How long will scoffers delight in their scoffing and fools hate knowledge?
- ²³ If you turn at My reproof, behold, I will pour out My spirit to you; I will make My words known to you.
- ²⁴ Because I have called and you refused to listen, I have stretched out My hand and no one has heeded,
- ²⁵ because you have ignored all My counsel and would have none of My reproof,
- ²⁶ I also will laugh at your calamity; I will mock when terror strikes you,
- ²⁷ when terror strikes you like a storm and your calamity comes like a whirlwind, when distress and anguish come upon you.



Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of July 18, 2010

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; the testimony of the Lord is sure, making wise the simple. Psalm 19.7

"O Love That Will Not Let Me Go" (sing or say these words together)

O Love that will not let me go, I rest my weary soul in Thee; I give Thee back the life I owe, That in Thine ocean depths its flow may richer, fuller be.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Proverbs 1.20-33; James 1.1-5; 3.13-18 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What does it mean to be wise? Why is it good to be wise?
- 2. Is wisdom something we earn as we grow older, or is it a gift from God?
- 3. What is the difference between the wisdom of this world and the wisdom which comes from God?
- 4. Are Proverbs concrete promises? Why should we learn them?
- 5. Why does God care about the choices we make?
- 6. What does wisdom show us about our own human nature?
- 7. How does God show His love and care for those who reject Him?
- 8. Will there ever be a Judgment Day?

Scripture Memory for July (memorize this verse of Scripture this month)
