

Questions for older children

- 7. Describe a situation where you need to stand firm.
- 8. How can striving side-by-side help us live a life worthy of the gospel?
- 9. Do you have someone you are striving with?

Challenge: This week spend some time talking with others about the gospel—what it is and why it demands everything from us.
