Minister: Lift up your hearts!


People: We lift them up to the Lord!

3. What does your name mean?
4. What is important about Jesus' name?
5. Why will everyone bow at the name of Jesus?

Questions for older children

6. What does it mean that Jesus Christ is Lord?
7. What impact does this reality have on your daily life?
8. Why will every tongue confess that He is Lord?
