

# Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of October 31, 2010

#### **Praise**

Call to Worship (everyone together)

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

"A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" (sing or say these words together)

A mighty fortress is our God, a bulwark never failing; Our helper He amid the flood of mortal ills prevailing. For still our ancient foe doth seek to work us woe; His craft and pow'r are great; and armed with cruel hate, On earth is not his equal.

# Hearing and Learning God's Word

**Scripture Reading:** Philippians 2.12-18 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

**Questions for Discussion** (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is obedience?
- 2. How do we know what the Lord wants us to do?
- 3. How does our obedience show our love for the Lord?
- 4. How does God help us obey?

### Questions for older children

- 5. Describe a time when you were disobedient to the Lord.
- 6. Describe a time in the past week when you were obedient to the Lord.
