

During the serving of Communion at 8:00, please use the following hymns for private meditation.



- 3. How does the Holy Spirit help us?
- 4. How does He help us remember what Jesus said?

Ouestions for older children

- 1. How often do you think about the Holy Spirit?
- 2. What questions do you have about the Holy Spirit?
- 3. How have you known the presence of the Holy Spirit?
