Minister: How do the sacraments become effectual means of salvation?

People: The sacraments become effectual means of salvation, not from any virtue in them, or in him that administers them; but only by the blessing of Christ, and the working of His Spirit in them, that by faith, receive them.

Minister: What is a sacrament?

People: A sacrament is a holy ordinance instituted by Christ; where, by sensible signs, Christ, and the benefits of the new covenant, are represented, sealed and applied to believers.

Minister: What is Baptism?

People: Baptism is a sacrament, where the washing with water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, does signify and seal our ingrafting into Christ, and partaking of the benefits of the covenant of grace, and our engagement to be the Lord's.

Minister: To whom is Baptism to be administered?

People: Baptism is not to be administered to any that are out of the visible church till they profess their faith in Christ and obedience to Him; but the infants of those who are members of the visible church are to be baptized.

Genesis 1.1-2

In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth. ² The earth was without form and void, and darkness was over the face of the deep. And the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters.

Isaiah 63.7-14

I will recount the steadfast love of the Lord, the praises of the Lord, according to all that the Lord has granted us, and the great goodness to the house of Israel that He has granted them according to His compassion, according to the abundance of His steadfast love. ⁸ For He said, “Surely they are My people, children who will not deal falsely.” And He became their Savior. ⁹ In all their affliction He was afflicted, and the angel of His presence saved them; in His love and in His pity He redeemed them; He lifted them up and carried them all the days of old.

¹⁰ But they rebelled and grieved His Holy Spirit; therefore He turned to be their enemy, and Himself fought against them. ¹¹ Then he remembered the days of old, of Moses and his people saying, “Where is He who brought them up out of the sea with the shepherds of His flock? Where is He who put in the midst of them His Holy Spirit, ¹² who caused His glorious arm to go at the right hand of Moses, who divided the waters before them to make for Himself an everlasting name, ¹³ who led them through the depths? Like a horse in the desert, they did not stumble. ¹⁴ Like livestock that go down into the valley, the Spirit of the Lord gave them rest. So You led Your people, to make for Yourself a glorious name.

“The Spirit’s Ministry in the Old Testament”

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of January 16, 2011

Praise

Call to Worship (*everyone together*)

Oh come, let us sing to the Lord; let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our salvation! Let us come into His presence with thanksgiving; let us make a joyful noise to Him with songs of praise!

Psalm 95.1-2

O worship the King, all glorious above, O gratefully sing His pow'r and His love;
Our shield and defender, the Ancient of Days, pavilioned in splendor and girded with praise.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: *Genesis 1.1-2; Isaiah 63.7-14; Psalm 51.10-12 (one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

1. Where do we first see the Holy Spirit's work in the Old Testament?
2. How was the Holy Spirit working in the Exodus from Egypt?
3. What did King David pray regarding the Holy Spirit in Psalm 51?

Questions for older children

1. What do you think it means to grieve the Holy Spirit?
2. What ministry did the Holy Spirit have in the Old Testament that continued in the New Testament and still today?

Scripture Memory for January (*memorize these verses of Scripture this month*)

John 14.15-17

If You love Me, you will keep My commandments. And I will ask the Father, and He will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Him nor knows Him. You know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you.

Prayer
