

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. List some of the fruits of the Spirit by memory if you can.
- 2. Why do you think the Bible describes it as fruit of the Spirit?
- 3. What is the opposite of the fruit of the Spirit?
- 4. How can we possess the fruit of the Spirit?

Questions for older children

- 1. Which of the fruits is a real challenge for you?
- 2. How do you wrestle against this challenge?
- 3. How does the Holy Spirit help us bear this fruit?
- 4. What is sanctification?
