

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: *Galatians* 5.16-26 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Why did Pastor Davis describe the walk as a fierce battle?
- 2. What does it mean to have opposition between the flesh and the Spirit?
- 3. How does walking by the Spirit make us free?
- 4. How does walking by the Spirit bear fruit in our lives?
- 5. What does John 15 tell us about the only way we can bear fruit?

Questions for older children

- 1. How have you experienced the fierceness of the battle between the flesh and the spirit?
- 2. Where have you experienced freedom in Christ toward obedience?
