
- 1. Do you acknowledge your child's need of the cleansing blood of Jesus Christ, and the renewing grace of the Holy Spirit?

*The Scripture Reading

Galatians 5.13-26

For you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. ¹⁴ For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁵ But if you bite and devour one another, watch out that you are not consumed by one another.

But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

¹⁷ For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do. ¹⁸ But if you are led by the Spirit, you are not under the law. ¹⁹ Now the works of the flesh are evident: sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality, ²⁰ idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy, fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions, ²¹ envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these. I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. ²² But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. ²⁴ And those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

²⁵ If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. ²⁶ Let us not become

conceited, provoking one another, envying one another.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: *Galatians* 5.13-26 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is love? Is it a feeling mostly, or something else?
- 2. Is joy the same thing as happiness? Can you have joy even when you're sad?
- 3. Why does Paul call love and joy the fruit of the Spirit?
- 4. Can you have love without joy? Can you have any of the fruit of the Spirit without all the fruit of the Spirit?

Ouestions for older children

- 1. What does Paul mean that Christ has set us free? From what? For what?
- 2. Why would understanding our freedom lead us to bear spiritual fruit?
- 3. If we need to understand our freedom to bear spiritual fruit, what can *we* do to aid our understanding? What must the *Spirit* do to aid our understanding?
