

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: *Galatians* 5:22-23; *John* 14:25-31; *John* 16:32-33; 2 *Peter* 3:14 (*one person read the Scripture aloud*)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is Peace and what is the Peace of the Lord? Is there a difference?
- 2. Why do we say, "The Peace of the Lord be with you . . . and also with you"?
- 3. How has God shown us He is a God of Peace?
- 4. Are you at Peace with God?
- 5. Are you at Peace with others?
- 6. What helps bring Peace (John 15)?
- 7. How are Peace and Patience connected?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why are so many Christians lacking Peace?
- 2. How have you known the Peace of the Lord?
- 3. From where did this Peace come?
- 4. Re-read John 14.25-31 and 16.32-33 and thank Him for His Peace.
