Public Confession of Sin

Our God, we praise You for the riches of Your kindness and patience toward us. Forgive our desire to live independently from You, to exercise our "freedom." Teach us again that true freedom is to be released from sin's power and dominion, that true freedom allows us to choose You rather than any substitute. Impress us again with Your long-suffering, that we might in turn be patient and kind toward others.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: *Psalm* 145 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How has God revealed His patience to you?
- 2. How does looking at the perfect character of God help us become who He has created us to be?
- 3. How is God kind?
- 4. Describe God's gentleness.

Questions for older children

- 1. Where do you need to grow in patience?
- 2. How will God's patience help your own?
- 3. Describe God's faithfulness to you.

Hebrews 12:1-2
