***The Scripture Reading**

Matthew 16.13-20

Now when Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, He asked His disciples, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?”¹⁴ And they said, “Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets.”¹⁵ He said to them, “But who do you say that I am?”¹⁶ Simon Peter replied, “You are the Christ, the Son of the living God.”¹⁷ And Jesus answered him, “Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah! Hearing and Learning God’s Word

2. What is the Old Testament word for “Christ”?
3. Why is Jesus called Christ? (hint – look at the Confession of Faith from the Order of Worship)
4. How did Peter know that Jesus is the Christ?
5. What is Jesus doing now for the Church?
