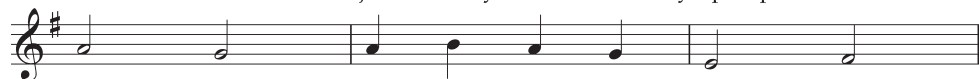

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: *Luke 22.39-46 (one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion (*may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times*)

1. What does it mean that “it was Jesus' custom to go out to the Mount of Olives”?
2. Why did Jesus go there on this occasion?
3. What did He want His disciples to do?
4. Why couldn't they stay awake?
5. Why did Jesus sweat blood?
6. What did Jesus pray to the Father?

Questions for older children

1. How does Christ's obedience help us?
2. How does it show self control?
3. What is so significant about sweating blood?

Scripture Memory for April (*memorize these verses of Scripture this month*)

Hebrews 12:1-2

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.
