Children's Sermon

9:30/11:00

Hosea 5:1-7

Hear this, O priests! Pay attention, O house of Israel! Give ear, O house of the king! For the judgment is for you; for you have been a snare at Mizpah and a net spread upon Tabor. ² And the revolters have gone deep into slaughter, but I will discipline all of them.

^{3'}I know Ephraim, and Israel is not hidden from me; for now, O Ephraim, you have played the whore; Israel is defiled. ⁴ Their deeds do not permit them to return to their God. For the spirit of whoredom is within them, and they know not the

Lord.

⁵ The pride of Israel testifies to his face; Israel and Ephraim shall stumble in his guilt; Judah also shall stumble with them. ⁶ With their flocks and herds they shall go to seek the Lord, but they will not find him; he has withdrawn from them. ⁷ They have dealt faithlessly with the Lord; for they have borne alien children. Now the new moon shall devour them with their fields.

6.1-7

"Come, let us return to the Lord; for he has torn us, that he may heal us; he has struck us down, and he will bind us up. ² After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him. ³ Let us know; let us press on to know the Lord; his going out is sure as the dawn; he will come to us as the showers, as the spring rains that water the earth."

⁴ What shall I do with you, O Ephraim? What shall I do with you, O Judah? Your love is like a morning cloud, like the dew that goes early away. ⁵ Therefore I have hewn them by the prophets; I have slain them by the words of my mouth, and my judgment goes forth as the light. ⁶ For I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice,

the knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings.

⁷ But like Adam they transgressed the covenant; there they dealt faithlessly with me.

11.1-2

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son. ² The more they were called, the more they went away; they kept sacrificing to the Baals and burning offerings to idols.

13.1-14

When Ephraim spoke, there was trembling; he was exalted in Israel, but he incurred guilt through Baal and died. ² And now they sin more and more, and make for themselves metal images, idols skillfully made of their silver, all of them the work of craftsmen. It is said of them, "Those who offer human sacrifice kiss calves!" ³ Therefore they shall be like the morning mist or like the dew that goes early away, like the chaff that swirls from the threshing floor or like smoke from a window.

- ⁴ But I am the Lord your God from the land of Egypt; you know no God but me, and besides me there is no savior. ⁵ It was I who knew you in the wilderness, in the land of drought; ⁶ but when they had grazed, they became full, they were filled, and their heart was lifted up; therefore they forgot me. ⁷ So I am to them like a lion; like a leopard I will lurk beside the way. ⁸ I will fall upon them like a bear robbed of her cubs; I will tear open their breast, and there I will devour them like a lion, as a wild beast would rip them open.
- ⁹ He destroys you, O Israel, for you are against me, against your helper.
 ¹⁰ Where now is your king, to save you in all your cities? Where are all your rulers— those of whom you said, "Give me a king and princes"? ¹¹ I gave you a king in my anger, and I took him away in my wrath. ¹² The iniquity of Ephraim is bound up; his sin is kept in store. ¹³ The pangs of childbirth come for him, but he is an unwise son, for at the right time he does not present himself at the opening of the womb.
- ¹⁴ Shall I ransom them from the power of Sheol? Shall I redeem them from Death? O Death, where are your plagues? O Sheol, where is your sting? Compassion is hidden from my eyes.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hosea 5:1-7; 6:1-7; 11:1-2; 13:1-14 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is wrong with the people of Israel?
- 2. What sins do they continue to commit?
- 3. What does it mean to be unfaithful?
- 4. What is idolatry?
- 5. Why does God judge their unfaithfulness?
- 6. How are we unfaithful?
- 7. How has God saved us from what we deserve?

Questions for older children

- 1. What does it mean in Hosea 6:6, "I desire steadfast love and not sacrifice?"
- 2. Why is Hosea 6 not a real repentance?
