Public Confession of Sin





Hosea 3 "Purchased from the Slave Market of Sin"

Order of Worship for the Home - The Week of July 10, 2011

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

Praise the LORD! I will give thanks to the LORD with my whole heart, in the company of the upright, in the congregation. Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them. Full of splendor and majesty is His work, and His righteousness endures forever.

Psalm 111.1-3

"Let Us Love and Sing and Wonder" (sing or say these words together)

Let us love and sing and wonder, let us praise the Savior's name! He has hushed the law's loud thunder, He has quenched Mount Sinai's flame: He has washed us with His blood, He has brought us nigh to God.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Hosea 3 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What did the people of Israel do wrong?
- 2. Why is it wrong to turn to other gods?
- 3. What other gods do people turn to today?
- 4. How does God show His love to the people if Israel through Hosea the prophet?
- 5. How has God purchased us?
- 6. How much does God love us?

Questions for older children

- 1. What gods are you tempted to pursue?
- 2. What is redemption?
- 3. How does God redeeming you lead you to love Him?
- 4. What was the price if your redemption?
