

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 7:24-29 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Have someone retell what Jesus is saying in Matthew 7:24-27.
- 2. What do the two men have in common?
- 3. What is the main difference between the two men?
- 4. What is the difference between listening and just hearing?
- 5. Why did the wise man's house stand?
- 6. Why did the foolish man's house fall?
- 7. Are you building on the Rock or sand?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why is the foundation so important?
- 2. Describe the storms in life that threaten to tear us down?
- 3. How well do you listen to God's word?
- 4. How is our obedience a sign that we are really listening?
- 5. How does Christ's death and resurrection give us power to listen and obey?
