Matthew 5.1-5

"Blessed are the Meek"

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of September 18, 2011

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God.

Psalm 42.1

"Ye Servants of God" (sing or say these words together)

Ye servants of God, your Master proclaim, And publish abroad His wonderful name. The name, all victorious, of Jesus extol; His Kingdom is glorious and rules over all.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 5.1-5. (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is meekness?
- 2. What did Jesus mean when He said the meek shall inherit the earth?
- 3. How can someone become meek?
- 4. How are the meek actually very strong?

Questions for older children

- 1. Do you think people today respect meekness? Why or why not?
- 2. How does looking to the Lord help us to be meek?

Scripture Memory for September (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

Matthew 6.19-21

Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.
