



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 5:6 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Describe a time when you were really hungry or thirsty. What did it feel like?
- 2. What is righteousness?
- 3. How can we hunger and thirst for righteousness?
- 4. What does it mean that He fills us?

Questions for older children

- 1. Who is our righteousness?
- 2. What in your life shows that you hunger and thirst for righteousness?
- 3. How does God satisfy this hunger?

Scripture Memory for September (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

Matthew 6.19-21
