



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 5.1-9 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How can we show mercy to one another?
- 2. How does God show us mercy?
- 3. What does it feel like to know one day every Christian will see God?
- 4. What does it mean to be pure in heart?
- 5. What are peacemakers?
- 6. How can we be peacemakers?
- 7. Who is the ultimate peace maker?

Questions for older children

- 1. What do you think is the difference between grace and mercy?
- 2. Why is it hard to show mercy?
- 3. Why must we look to God for mercy in order to show others mercy?
- 4. Do you think often of seeing God? Why/why not? Pause now and consider that day.
- 5. Where do you need to seek peace?
- 6. Why is it important to know we are sons of God?
