

Psalm 19

"Revelation's Role and Result"

Order of Worship for the Home – The Week of February 12, 2012

Praise

Call to Worship (everyone together)

Praise the LORD! Praise the LORD from the heavens; praise Him in the heights! Praise Him, all His angels; praise Him, all His hosts!

"Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" (sing or say these words together)

Love divine, all loves excelling, joy of heav'n to earth come down; Fix in us Thy humble dwelling, all Thy faithful mercies crown. Jesus, Thou art all compasion, pure, unbounded love Thou art; Visit us with Thy salvation, enter ev'ry trembling heart.

Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 19 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. Do you think that the person who wrote Psalm 19 liked to go outside and look at God's creation? Why?
- 2. What is your favorite thing to look at in God's creation outside?
- 3. Why does God's creation impress you?
- 4. What do you think God's creation tells us about God?
- 5. What kinds of things does the Bible tell us about God that creation doesn't tell us?

Questions for older children

- 1. What is God's glory?
- 2. Can we really understand God's creation without the scriptures?
- 3. What does God want us to think about when we look at creation?
- 4. In what ways does Psalm 19 instruct us in the worship of God?

Scripture Memory for February (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

Colossians 1.15-16

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by Him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through Him and for Him.
