Minister: What is it to pray in the name of Christ?

People: To pray in the name of Christ is, in obedience to His command, and in confidence on His promises, to ask mercy for His sake; not by bare mentioning of His name, but by drawing our encouragement to pray, and our boldness, strength, and hope

of acceptance in prayer, from Christ and His mediation.

Minister: Why are we to pray in the name of Christ?

People: The sinfulness of man, and his distance from God by reason thereof, being so great, as that we can have no access into His presence without a mediator; and there being none in heaven or earth appointed to, or fit for, that glorious work but Christ alone, we are to pray in no other name but His only.

Public Confession of Sin

Our Father, who hears our prayers, teach us to live by prayer as well as by providence. Give us hearts formable to Your will; so that we might live in prayer, and honor You, being kept from evil, known and unknown. Help us to see the sin that accompanies all we do; there is no part of our lives which is untouched by it. Let us know that the work of prayer is to bring our wills to Yours, and without this it is folly to pray: when we try to bring Your will to ours, we command Christ, to be above Him, and wiser than He: this is our sin and pride. Our Father, help us see that there is no wrath like the wrath of being governed by our own desires for our own ends. Teach us from the heart to say, "Your will be done," recognizing that this is for our greatest good as well as for Your greatest glory.

Matthew 6.1-18

"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.

² "Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ³ But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁵ "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ⁶ But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

⁷ "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. ⁸ Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask Him. ⁹ Pray then like this:

"Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name.

- ¹⁰ Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
- ¹¹ Give us this day our daily bread,
- ¹² and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors.
- ¹³ And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
- ¹⁴ For if you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, ¹⁵ but if you do not forgive others their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.
- ¹⁶ "And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷ But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you."



Scripture Reading: Matthew 6.1-18 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What are the acts of righteousness that Jesus tells us not to practice in order to be seen by others?
- 2. What is a hypocrite?
- 3. What reward do the hypocrites receive?
- 4. Where does the Father look in order to reward His followers?
- 5. What happens if we seek the praise of man?

Questions for older children

- 1. Why do people want the praise of man?
- 2. How is this short-sighted?
- 3. How have you sought the praise of man?
- 4. How can we stop seeking man's praise?

Scripture Memory for March (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

Isaiah 53.4-6

Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
