



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 6.7-13 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. How is God the best Father?
- 2. What does "Hallowed be Thy name" mean?
- 3. What is a petition?
- 4. What are the petitions in the Lord's Prayer?

Questions for older children

- 1. How should this prayer be used in our lives?
- 2. What is significant about each petition?
- 3. How can this prayer change the way you pray?

Scripture Memory for March (memorize these verses of Scripture this month)

Isaiah 53.4-6

Surely He has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed Him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But He was wounded for our transgressions; He was crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of us all.
