

- Minister: We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. - Women: We know that our old self was crucified with Him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him. Romans 6.6-8
- Minister: For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself.





***The Scripture Reading**

Matthew 27.57-28.15

^{27.57} When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who also was a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸ He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. ⁵⁹ And Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen shroud ⁶⁰ and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had cut in the rock. And he rolled a great stone to the entrance of the tomb and went away.

⁶¹ Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb. ⁶² The next day, that is, after the day of Preparation, the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered before Pilate ⁶³ and said, "Sir, we remember how that impostor said, while He was still alive, 'After three days I will rise.' ⁶⁴ Therefore order the tomb to be made secure until the third day, lest His disciples go and steal Him away and tell the people, 'He has risen from the dead,' and the last fraud will be worse than the first." ⁶⁵ Pilate said to them, "You have a guard of soldiers. Go, make it as secure as you can." ⁶⁶ So they went and made the tomb secure by sealing the stone and setting a guard.

great earthquake, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone and sat on it.³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow.⁴ And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. ⁵ But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where He lay.⁷ Then go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead, and behold, He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him. See, I have told you." ⁸ So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell His disciples.⁹ And behold, Jesus met them and said, "Greetings!" And they came up and took hold of His feet and worshiped Him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see Me." ¹¹ While they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and told the chief priests all that had taken place. ¹² And when they had assembled with the elders and taken counsel, they gave a sufficient sum of money to the soldiers ¹³ and said, "Tell people, 'His disciples came by night and stole Him away while we were asleep.' ¹⁴ And if this comes to the governor's ears, we will satisfy him and keep you out of trouble." ¹⁵ So they took the money and did as they were directed. And this story has been spread among the Jews to this day.



Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 27.57-28.15 (one person read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several *times*)

- 1. Name all the faces that were at the tomb.
- 2. Describe each person at the tomb and their actions.
- 3. Who was Joseph of Arimathea and what is significant about his role at the tomb?
- 4. Why was there a guard at the tomb?
- 5. After the body was gone from the tomb, what were the soldiers paid to tell people?
- 6. Why did Jesus rise from the dead?
- 7. What does His resurrection mean for us?

Questions for older children

- 1. Take a few minutes to consider what it must have been like for Joseph of Arimathea to handle the dead body of Christ. Why do you think he did it?
- 2. What is significant about the soldiers' pay-off? Why did they take it?
- 3. What is significant about Matthew 28.15?
- 4. What lies continue to be spread today about Jesus and His resurrection?
