Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Matthew 7.1-6 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What does it mean to judge another person?
2. Why does Jesus tell us not to judge?
3. Why do we judge others?
4. What is Jesus' lesson about "the speck and the log"?
5. How can we keep from judging others?

Questions for older children

1. Who do you often judge? Why?
2. Why do people like judging others?
3. Why is judging others so dangerous?
4. What, according to Christ, will happen to those who judge?
5. What is your response?
6. How can the cross help keep us from judging others?
