



Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What are the three commands from this passage?
- 2. What are the three commands talking about?
- 3. What is prayer?
- 4. List some things you most consistently ask God for in prayer.
- 5. How is God described here?
- 6. How is God similar to earthly fathers? How is He different and better?

Questions for older children

- 1. What do you ask God for the most? Why?
- 2. What do you think you should be asking for in prayer?
- 3. Do we always get what we want from God? Why not?
