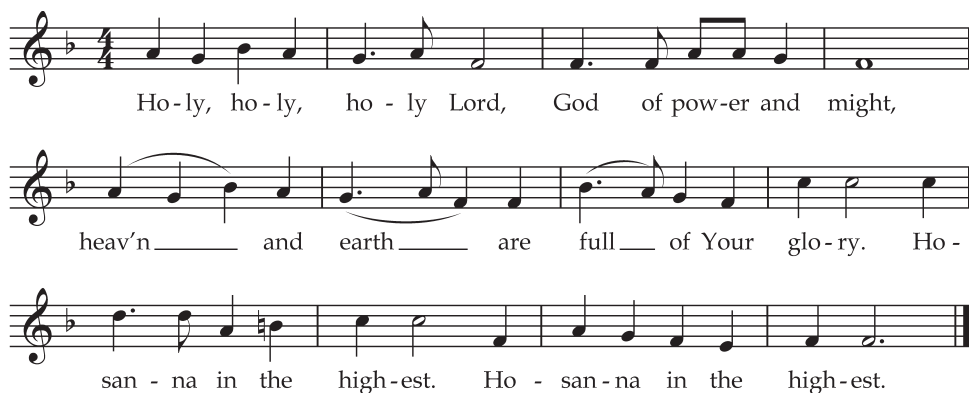

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Haggai 2.1-9 *(one person read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. Have your parents ever asked you to do something you thought was impossible? What was it and how did you feel?
2. What was the Lord asking Israel to do and why were they feeling sorrowful about that work?
3. What was the Lord promising to do for Israel as they finished what He asked of them? And why would that matter to them?
4. What does the Lord ask of us and how do Jesus’ promises to us help us do what He asks?

Questions for older children

1. Was Jesus just exaggerating when He said, “you must be perfect” (Mt 5:48)? Why or why not?
2. Is being perfect about what I’m like as a person, what I live for, or both?
3. What can I do to become more like Him and to live more for Him and His will?
4. How do God’s promises to me in Jesus help me to become more like Him and to live more for Him?

Scripture Memory for June: *(memorize these verses of Scripture this month)*

Luke 24.25-27

And He said to them, “O foolish ones, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary that the Christ should suffer these things and enter into His glory?” And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, He interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself.
