Jonah 1.1-6

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before Me." ³ But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went on board, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD. ⁴ But the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. ⁵ Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep. ⁶ So the captain came and said to him, "What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your God! Perhaps the God will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

Praise

Hearing and Learning God’s Word

Scripture Reading: Jonah 1.1-6 *(one person may read the Scripture aloud)*

Questions for Discussion *(may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)*

1. What is the story of Jonah about? What did Pastor Paul say that the story of Jonah is about?
2. What does it mean to be a rebel? How did Jonah rebel against God? How do you rebel against God? What does God have for rebels?
3. What did God send to rescue Jonah? Has God ever used anything difficult in your life to rescue you?
4. Pastor Paul said that the Grace of God has a name. What is his name? How does he offer us grace?

Questions for older children

1. Jonah did not want to go to Nineveh because he did not think they deserved God's grace. Is there anyone that you think does not deserve God's grace? Do you deserve God's grace?
2. How is Jesus the true and greater Jonah? What did Jesus do willingly for us that Jonah struggled to do for Nineveh?
3. Read Matthew 12.39-41. Jonah spent three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish. How is this like Jesus?
