## Public Confession of Sin

Our gracious and merciful Father, when we look at Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars, which You have set in place, what is man that You are mindful of him, and the son of man that You care for him? 3. How is Jesus mightier than the storm?
4. What other types of storms do we face in life?
5. How does Jesus help us?

#### **Questions for older children**

1. How is the church like a boat on water?
2. What storms are you currently facing?
3. How can this miracle teach us to pray?
4. What does our Savior promise us?
