- Do you, the members of the Session of this congregation, continue to profess your readiness to receive Joseph "Skip" Ryan to be your Assistant Pastor?
- 2. Do you promise to receive the word of truth from his mouth with meekness and love?

- 4. Do you engage to continue to him, while he is your Assistant Pastor, that competent worldly maintenance which you have promised, and to furnish him with whatever you may see needful for the honor of religion and for his comfort among you?





Hearing and Learning God's Word

Scripture Reading: Psalm 51.10-19 (one person may read the Scripture aloud)

Questions for Discussion (may be answered in one worship time or spread over several times)

- 1. What is perseverance?
- 2. Why do we need to persevere in worship?
- 3. How can we persevere?
- 4. How does the Holy Spirit help us persevere?

Questions for older children

- 1. What distractions do you experience during worship?
- 2. How can you battle these distractions?
- 3. How can prayer help you persevere?
- 4. How can we increase our longing for God and for worshipping God?

Scripture Memory for October: (memorize these verses of Scripture)

Romans 1.16-17

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."
